

15 Days of Winter Break

DIY Snow Globe

What You Need:

- empty glass jar or plastic container with lid
- glue (glue gun recommended)
- decorations that can fit inside container, like a toy car
- cotton balls or fake snow
- glitter (optional)

Instructions:

1. Decide if you want the bottom of the jar or the inside of the lid to be your base, or bottom of your snow globe.
2. Stretch out the cotton balls (or use fake snow) to create a snowy ground on your base. If wanted, use glitter to give it that new snow look. When you're happy with how it looks, glue the snow to your base.
3. Take your decoration(s) and glue it on top of the snow.
4. Attach the lid to the container and be amazed!

If you want to make this a true snow globe with water and glitter, alternate instructions are on the back of this sheet.

What You Need:

- empty glass jar or plastic container with lid
- glue (glue gun recommended)
- decorations that can fit inside container, like a toy car
- glitter
- light corn syrup or glycerin
- water
- clear spray paint (optional)

Instructions:

1. Decide if you want the bottom of the jar or the inside of the lid to be your base, or bottom of your snow globe. It will look nicer with the lid as the base, but there is also the possibility of water leaking out if you're not careful.
2. Be aware that your decoration(s) can be damaged submerged in water. Consider coating with a clear spray paint to protect the decoration(s).
3. Take your decoration(s) and glue it to the base. Let the glue dry overnight.
4. Fill the jar almost to the top with hot water. Add 1-2 tablespoons of light corn syrup or glycerin and stir.
5. Add glitter and stir more. Make sure the liquid doesn't overflow.
6. Carefully attach the lid. Consider using glue to really seal it on.
7. Be amazed!
